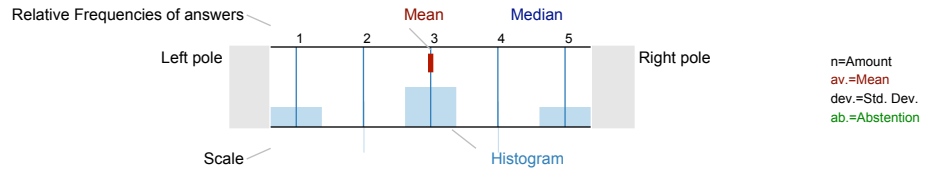

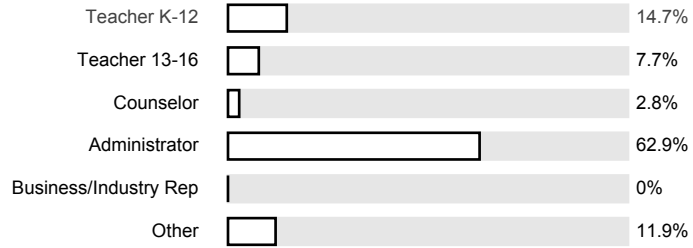

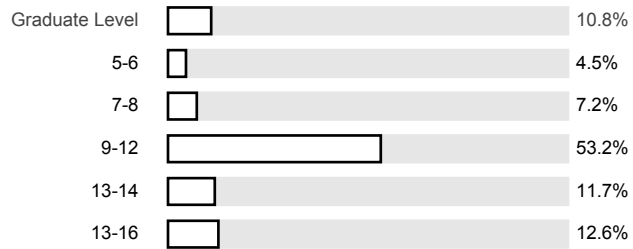

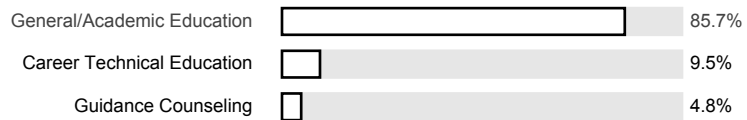
1.2) Which best describes your primary responsibility?

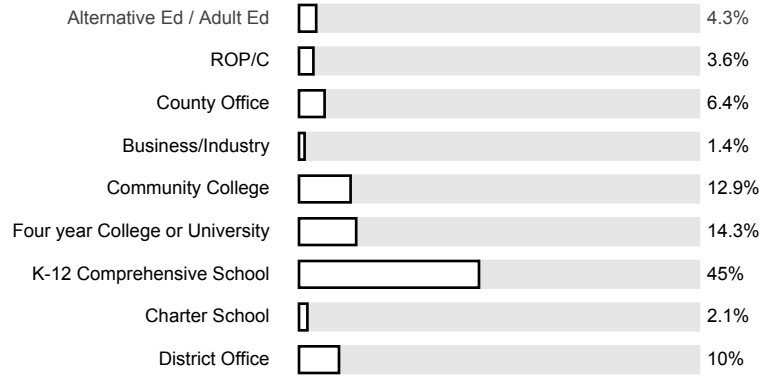
1.3) Which best describes your primary subject area?

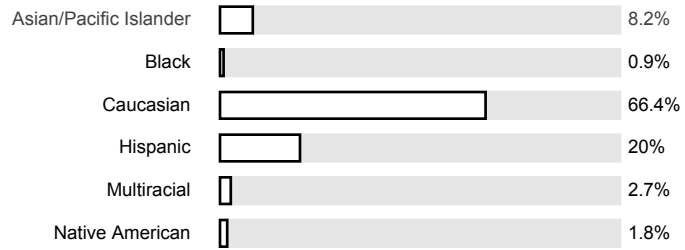

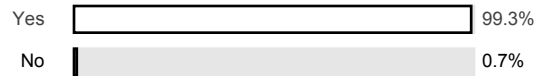

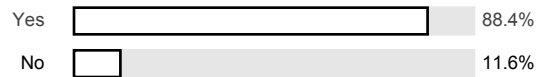

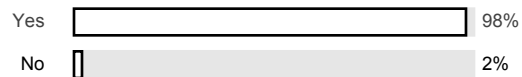
2.4) Which breakout session track did you attend? n=147



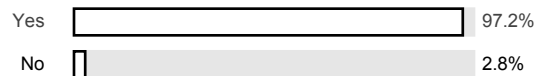
2.5) Did the breakout session meet your expectations? n=147



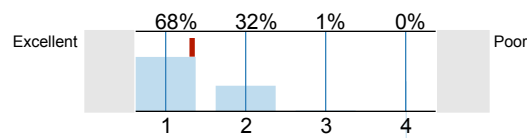

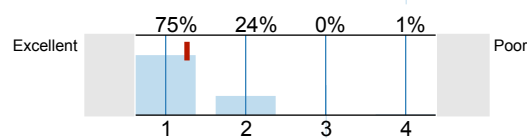

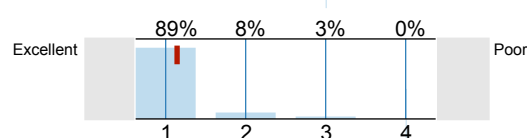

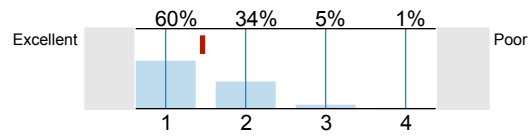
